## **Associate in Pre-Registered Nursing Guidelines (Pre-BSN)**

- The Associate in Pre-Registered Nursing DTA is a specialized Associate of Arts (Option A) degree designed to help students fulfill the course requirements for admission into a BSN Major when they transfer as a junior.
- It is very important that you consult regularly with the Educational Planning and Advising Center advisors and the University Nursing programs you are considering. Ultimately, the monitoring of your educational choices and class selection is your responsibility as a student.
- An Application for Graduation should be completed and submitted to the Registration Office when you have completed 45 credits of college level coursework (classes numbered 100 level or higher).
- The following Washington universities and colleges recognize the Associate in Pre-Registered Nursing and have direct transfer agreements: University of Washington-Seattle, Washington State University, Northwest University, Pacific Lutheran University, Seattle University, Seattle Pacific University, and Walla Walla College.
- The Associate in Pre-Registered Nursing requires that you complete 90 credits numbered 100 and higher and that you earn at least 23 of the 90 credits from Highline Community College.
- A 2.00 cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) is needed to graduate with and Associate of Pre-Nursing degree but all of the university nursing programs require a significantly higher GPA requirement for admission.
- Besides the Associate in Pre-Registered Nursing class requirements, admission into many Nursing programs may require medical experience (work or volunteer), completion of a proctored essay and faculty or employee recommendations. Check the specific application details with the BSN programs that you are interested in pursuing.
- Application deadlines for University Nursing Programs may differ from the University deadline for general application.

NOTE: Class listings reflect the new common course numbering for all Washington State Community and Technical Colleges. Classes listed with a “&” indicate a common course number. Those classes that do not have this sign are Highline course numbers and are transferable as part of the Direct Transfer Agreement.
